Amendment:

Resolution No. 7-178 is a Resolution proposing an amendment to article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Yap to be voted on by the voters in the November 2, 2010 General Election.

The amendment to be voted on is to add a new section 11 to Article XIV of the Constitution which read as follows:

“Section 11. The Legislature, by two third vote, shall present to the people on a ballot during an Election the question: “Shall the State of Yap commence a review of its political status?” If a Two-third of the ballots cast upon the question is in the affirmative, the Legislature shall prescribe by the law the manner for the review of the political status of Yap State within six Months after the referendum.”

Yap State is part of the Federated States of Micronesia, as it has been since 1986 and amending the State Constitution is simply to have it in the Constitution so that one day upon determination by the Leadership of Yap State to have the political status of Yap State reviewed, the Constitution will have a provision that authorizes the Legislature to ask the people whether the political status Yap State should be reviewed.

The amendment is for Yap State to amend its Constitution to authorize the Legislature to ask the question: “Shall the State of Yap commence a review of its political Status?.”
